ORGANIZATION

The Cancer Prevention Institute of California (CPIC), formerly the Northern California Cancer Center, is a non-profit, independent research organization working successfully since 1974 towards its mission of preventing cancer and reducing the burden of the disease. Our exceptionally talented team of 15 doctoral-level research scientists is recognized internationally for its contributions to cancer surveillance, epidemiology, biostatistics, and cancer control. CPIC, also a partner in the NCI-designated Stanford Cancer Center, is located in the San Francisco Bay Area, geographically advantageous for transdisciplinary collaborations with area institutions, including Stanford, University of California, San Francisco, University of California, Berkeley, California Department of Public Health, and Kaiser Division of Research. Our researchers collaborate extensively internally and with scientists from a wide range of disciplines at these institutions and others across the nation and world. The CPIC research portfolio includes large multi-institutional programs, including the renowned NCI Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) cancer registry; the NCI Breast and Colon Cancer Family Registries; and the California Teachers Study. Our research program, which is supported by grants from NIH, US Department of Defense, California Breast Cancer Research Program, and private foundations, is dynamic and responsive to cutting-edge science. It has a strong focus on breast, colon, and prostate cancers and lymphomas; childhood cancers; genetic and molecular epidemiology; cancer surveillance; disparities and underserved populations, especially Asians and Hispanics; immigrant populations; contextual factors; cancer outcomes and survivorship; and community-based participatory research.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

We seek a dynamic, innovative, and seasoned leader for our research team. The Director of Research will serve as a vital member of CPIC leadership and provide strategic direction and administrative oversight of our research program to advance CPIC's mission. The successful candidate will work with CPIC's scientists, administration, and advisory board to articulate and grow our vision for the CPIC research program today and into the future. The Director of Research will guide the expansion of our internal and external research collaborations, taking advantage of our scientific breadth, expertise, and collegiality, and leveraging the resources and collaborations available in the Research Program. He/she will oversee and participate in the mentorship of our research scientists, promote visibility and dissemination of research program activities and achievements to the scientific community and the



public, manage the fiscal and other resources available to the overall research program, and work with Stanford Cancer Center leadership to promote mutually beneficial collaborations.

The Director of Research position is 50% time, leaving an opportunity for the successful candidate also to carry out and enrich his/her own research program. The position offers the qualified candidate eligibility for a consulting faculty appointment at the Stanford University School of Medicine and for membership in the Stanford Cancer Center. The ideal candidate will have a doctoral degree in a discipline related to the work of the organization and a strong record of research productivity and leadership. Experience in a public, non-profit, or academic research environment is required, and experience in population-based cancer research is strongly desired.

COMPENSATION

CPIC offers a competitive compensation and benefits package that includes medical, dental, and vision insurance for employees and their families, a 403(B) plan with a generous company contribution, disability and life insurance for employees, and holidays and paid time off.
