



JOB OPPORTUNITY ANSIRH seeks Assistant Researcher

Advancing New Standards in Reproductive Health (ANSIRH), part of the Bixby Center for Global Reproductive Health at the University of California, San Francisco, is seeking a scholar to conduct research for the *Evaluation of Abortion Restrictions* and *Evidence Based Facility Standards* studies. The *Evaluation of Abortion Restrictions* project seeks to analyze the effects of new state-level abortion restrictions on women. The *Evidence Based Facility Standards* project seeks to conduct rigorous research to inform evidence-based standards for abortion facility regulation. Responsibilities will involve working with the Principal Investigator to design data-collection tools, identify recruitment sites, implement study protocols, oversee data collection and management, conduct data analyses and publish papers in the peer-reviewed literature. The Researcher will work directly with Dr. Sarah Roberts, Principal Investigator of the projects.

For this position, we are looking specifically for someone with a proven history of conducting public health or other health services-related research and publishing in peer reviewed journals. A PhD or DrPH in Public Health, Health Policy, Health Services, Sociology, Nursing, or a related field is required. The candidate must have outstanding academic writing skills and a strong background in qualitative interviewing and study design. The candidate must also have some quantitative data analysis experience, preferably in Stata; skill in synthesizing research from multiple sources and disciplines to find clear themes and applications is preferred. Experience with multivariate and hierarchical/longitudinal data analyses and experience with or knowledge of abortion, patient safety, health departments, and state policy are also preferred.
