The branch manages all aspects of the Washington, D.C. based <u>International Training Program</u>, including the selection of workshop topics, the identification of workshop participants, and instructing courses. TSDB also manages the Regional Workshop Program and a number of multi-year



country-specific statistical development initiatives. Additionally, the branch develops and maintains the <u>Demographic Analysis and Population Projections System (DAPPS)</u>, a public domain software package designed to assist users in analyzing and producing population projections. TSDB staff members regularly collaborate with other staff within the International Programs area and across the Census Bureau.

The TSDB is seeking a Survey Statistician/Demographer to assist the branch in fulfilling its mission.

Key responsibilities include:

- Provide training and technical assistance to NSO counterparts in various census or survey related activities (planning and management, budget formulation, questionnaire and enumerator manual design and development, field staff training, data processing, analysis, and dissemination) through short-term field missions to developing countries
- Participate in strategic planning exercises associated with the Washington, D.C. based International Training Program
- Collaborate with staff in the development of DAPPS
- Develop and update training materials for international workshops
- Liaise with a variety of foreign governments, universities, and local and international stakeholders in census and survey operations

- Proven commitment to high-level technical expertise in statistical training and capacity building
- Ability to build partnerships with national institutions and other organizations involved in the development process
