Position Announcement: Assistant Professor (Practice) for Social Demography Location: Oregon State University Campus, Corvallis

The Extension Family and Community Health (FCH) Program, and the Division of Outreach & Engagement (O&E) at Oregon State University, invite applications for a full-time (1.0 FTE), 12-month, fixed-term (non-tenure-track) Extension Assistant Professor (Practice) position in social demography. The individual in this position will develop a statewide Extension program to study population dynamics in Oregon, and will work with colleagues in Extension and O&E to build programs that serve Oregon communities.

This position is at the rank of Assistant Professor of Practice, located on the OSU campus in Corvallis. The Professor of Practice is an academic series at Oregon State University that is expected to develop a creative, original professional program that contributes to the goals of Extension programming as well as the evidence base for effective community programming. As a fixed-term position, it is renewable annually. The position is not tenured, but it allows for advancement through the ranks of Assistant, Associate, and Full Professor of Practice, following procedures described in the OSU Promotion and tenure guidelines, available online at: <http://oregonstate.edu/admin/aa/faculty-handbook-promotion-and-tenure-guidelines#Practice>

Position responsibilities include obtaining external funding and leading grant projects. At present, this individual will be the Principal Investigator for several ongoing grant projects (currently estimated at .35 FTE), which support 2.5 additional FTE.

The faculty member reports jointly to the Extension Family and Community Health (FCH) Program Leader and the Vice Provost for O&E. The position's academic affiliation is with the School of Social and Behavioral Health Sciences (SOBE) in the College of Public Health and Human Sciences (CPHHS). Duties include 45% Program Delivery and Implementation; 35% Leadership and Program Design; 10% Scholarship; and 10% Service.

Major Responsibilities (selected list; see website posting for the comprehensive list)

- Capacity-building: Serve as an educational resource for demographic information in Oregon and provide training and support for accessing and using secondary sources of information such as census and state databases. Provide consultation and support for program needs assessments and evaluations.
- Research: Work with state and regional audiences, at sites on and off campus, to provide client-centric social demographic analyses, with particular emphasis on implications for community development and change. Conduct research that is theoretically sound and aligned with current standards of practice, using best demographic techniques that prioritize the quality and usefulness of data.
- Dissemination and Outreach: Communicate through reports and other formats about demographic trends, research findings, and characteristics of different communities.
- Develop proposals for extramural funding to support projects and programming.
- Conduct applied research and engaged scholarship on social demographic topics aligned with the Division's needs and FCH priorities related to population change and composition, workforce/labor markets, education, and economic opportunities.

Degree-related Qualifications (see website posting for the comprehensive list of required and preferred qualifications):

- Required: Master's degree with at least one degree in a discipline closely related to social demography.
- Preferred: PhD, with at least one degree in a discipline closely related to social demography.
- Preferred: At least one degree in public health, human sciences, or other field related to the Extension Family and Community Health Program.

To ensure full consideration, applications must be received by September 15, 2016. Applications will continue to be accepted after the full consideration date, until a sufficient applicant pool has been achieved or the position is filled. The closing date is subject to change without notice to applicants.

When applying, you will be required to attach the following electronic documents:

- 1) A resume/CV that includes the names of at least three professional references, their e-mail addresses and telephone contact numbers (Upload as 'Other Document' if not included with your resume/CV).
- 2) A cover letter indicating how your qualifications and experience have prepared you for this position.
