The Department of Global Health and Population at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health seeks candidates for the position of assistant or associate professor of global health. This is a tenure-ladder position, with the academic rank to be determined in accordance with the successful candidate's experience and accomplishments.

The department seeks candidates to conduct rigorous quantitative and qualitative research on health systems and health system reforms. The candidate is expected to undertake research to assess new health policies and interventions in health systems, and conduct comparative analysis in multiple-country settings. The successful candidate will be expected to play an important role in the department's research and teaching programs for health systems. Specific areas of focus or specialization could include design, implementation and evaluation of new models for organization, service delivery, purchasing, and health financing in health systems, and political economy of health system reform. The candidate will have a global perspective but devote a significant proportion of his/her time to research on the health systems in middle and low-income nations; overseas travel for fieldwork is envisaged.

Candidates should hold a doctoral degree in a relevant social science discipline such as political economy, anthropology, epidemiology, economics, political science, organizational behavior, management or public policy and a demonstrated record of inter-disciplinary work. Expertise and interest in using mixed methods combining quantitative and qualitative methods of inquiry preferred. Prior research experience related to health systems and health systems reform, significant international field experience in at least one region of the developing world is highly desirable.
